


Images, video, and audio "pinned" to Google Maps and layered onto Street View to "witness" the past in the present

REMEMBER:

The main goal is student learning NOT the technology.

The Process is more important than the product.

Remember the REFLECTION Documentary Reflections:

"I learned that I'm willing to work hard and that I don't give up easily."

"That obviously there isn't just one thing that we have to do to become more sustainable. But that it is a constant thing that will never go completely away but WE need to do our best to do what we can. We can make the better choice and try to take that step to become more sustainable."

"I learned that we have a great future map of Utah's water which makes me happy. I did learn that we don't have enough water if we just keep wasting, if we take little steps right now and start to conserve like shut off water then you are good and our future doesn't need to be worried about."

"I learned that I need to love my parents more because they went thru hard things."
