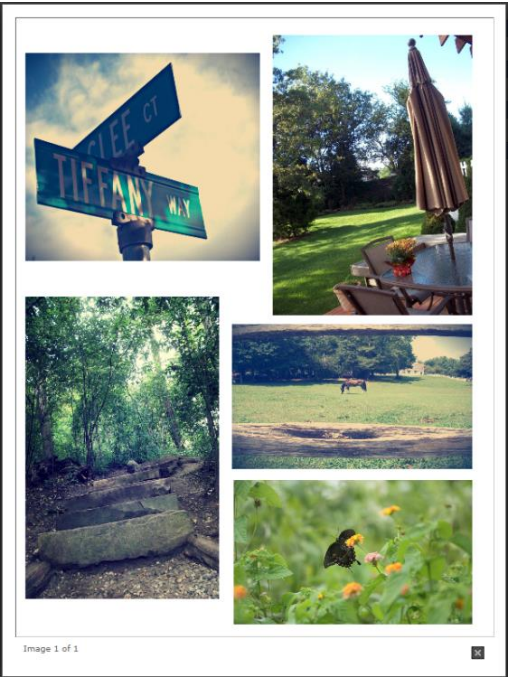

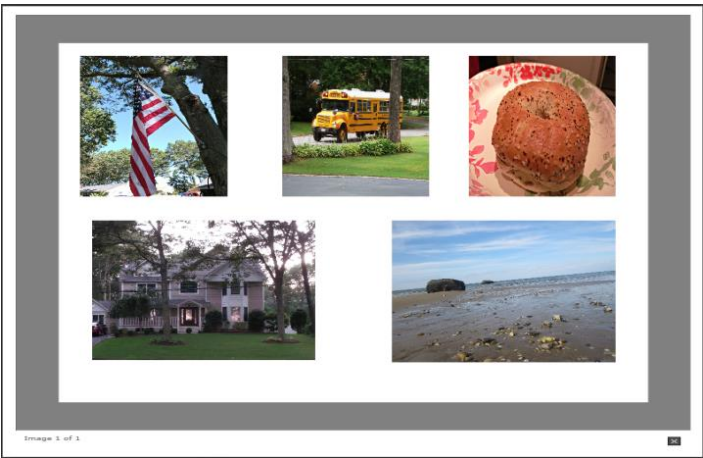

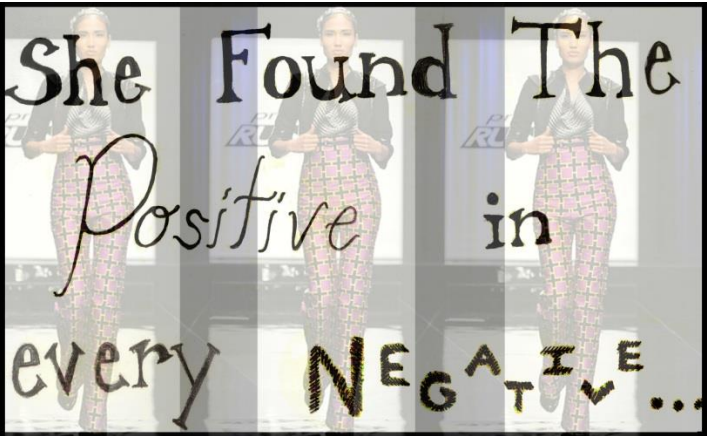
“Welcome to My Life” Project Group
